"ASEAN-JAPAN WORKSHOP ON PROMOTING GENDER EQUALITY IN SPORTS"

In 2017, ASEAN and Japan held the First ASEAN Plus Japan Ministerial Meeting on Sports (AMMS+Japan) to foster a strong sense of resilience and building solidarity with the peoples of ASEAN region and Japan by promoting a healthy lifestyle and developing close people-to-people ties through sports. Following this High-Level commitment, Japanese Center for Research on Women in Sport (JCRWS) at Juntendo University (Executive Director: Etsuko Ogasawara) is pleased to announce the convening of "ASEAN-JAPAN Workshop on Promoting Gender Equality in Sports", an action to promote gender equality in sports. As part of the ASEAN-Japan Actions on Sports project, this event contributes to the implementation of ASEAN-Japan cooperation in sports and ASEAN Work Plan on Sports 2021-2025. For better outreach, JCRWS will also hold an open symposium which will be accessible to the general public on 11th August 2021.

ASEAN-JAPAN Workshop on Promoting Gender Equality in Sports

Objectives

- A four-day workshop will be held in the light of the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games to
- strengthen cooperation between ASEAN and Japan by promoting gender equality in sports.

With a view to achieving a gender-equal society and promoting women's sports participation in the ASEAN region, and with its commitment to support the achievement on Gender Equality (SDGs Goal 5), government officials from ASEAN Member States, a representative of the Women in Sports Commission at their respective National Olympic Committees (NOCs) and young women's leaders will gather online to develop a feasible action plan for fostering women's sports and to develop the next generation of women's leaders

Target of "ASEAN-JAPAN Workshop on Promoting Gender Equality in Sports"

- 1. To develop an action plan for each ASEAN country to promote the participation of women in sports in ASEAN.
- 2. To empower young women in ASEAN countries through life skills and leadership training in sports.


